Identify Emerging Tools



 What do I need a new tool or technology to accomplish?




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Professional Learning Network

Professional Learning Networks (PLN) help to identify resources and emerging technologies that are currently implemented in classrooms locally and globally.

Considerations:

Does my state or content area have an education association or teaching community that provides access to emerging technologies?
 Considering social media sources (ex. blogs, YouTube, Facebook, etc.), which teachers or organizations should I follow or subscribe to for more teaching advice and hacks?



Common Sense Education

Common Sense Education identifies research-based classroom tools that support student learning. It allows teachers to filter tools by grade level, content area, and platform, and complete reviews on digital tools.

Considerations:

Is this tool suitable for the grade level and technological needs of my students?
What form of training (ex. modeling or tutorial videos) is necessary for me and my students?



Identifying and assessing resources and new technologies is challenging. Teachers can join Professional Learning Networks (PLNs) to help identify emerging technologies used by teachers.
