

### Provide Structured Learning

### Design for Independent Learning

#### Choose the Right Tools



Break learning into smaller and manageable chunks



Provide students
with feedback and
help students learn
how to effectively
evaluate their work



Keep online instruction short, manageable, and clear



Clarify expectations for student online participation



Incorporate choice into learning that maps to the learning outcomes



Consider making video instructions instead of text to engage students



Provide frequent
and constructive
feedback on student
work and
communicate with
students to keep
them motivated



Design learning
experiences that do
not require help and
support from
parents/guardians
who may be unable to
help



Limit the number of tools, apps, and platforms to make students and their parents less overwhelmed



Make online
meetings, live chats,
or video tutorials
available to
maintain a human
connection



Provide a checklist of the assignments, schedules, and expectations for parents/guardians



Keep the importance of privacy and cybersecurity in mind when using videoconferencing platforms
