Considerations for Implementing Online Lessons



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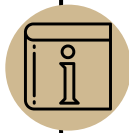
Provide Structured Learning

Design for Independent Learning

Choose the Right Tools



Break learning into smaller and manageable chunks



Clarify expectations for student online participation



Provide frequent and constructive feedback on student work and communicate with students to keep them motivated



Make online meetings, live chats, or video tutorials available to maintain a human connection



Provide students with feedback and help students learn how to effectively evaluate their work



Incorporate choice into learning that maps to the learning outcomes



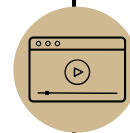
Design learning experiences that do not require help and support from parents/guardians who may be unable to help



Provide a checklist of the assignments, schedules, and expectations for parents/guardians



Keep online instruction short, manageable, and clear



Consider making video instructions instead of text to engage students



Limit the number of tools, apps, and platforms to make students and their parents less overwhelmed



Keep the importance of privacy and cybersecurity in mind when using videoconferencing platforms
