Characteristics of *Effective*Online Feedback



SPECIFIC

Goal: Use **specific** feedback to inspire **growth** and give students **clear guidance** on how to improve.

Instead of providing general feedback such as "good job", consider:

- Telling students what they have done well and providing specific opportunities for improvement
- Specifying tasks students need to complete
- Making feedback goal-oriented and actionable





PERSONALIZED

Goal: Use personalized feedback to enhance class satisfaction.

Consider:

- Using student names in the feedback
- Tailoring feedback to individual work
- Use personal greetings and closings






TIMELY

Goal: Providing **timely** feedback can help students stay on **track** and maintain their **motivation** for learning.

Consider:

- Giving feedback within 48 hours of assignment submission/due dates.
- Consistently reassuring students that all stakeholders are committed to their success





INNOVATIVE

Goal: Integrating **technology tools** make it possible to provide feedback in more **efficient** ways to engage students.

Consider:

- Recording feedback in audio formats rather than writing it
- Providing real-time feedback in shared documents
- Utilizing student peer review scenarios
