
# Universal Design for Learning (UDL)

## Strategies for **Multiple Means of Engagement**

Multiple Means of Engagement is the first principle of the Universal Design for Learning framework. This principle keeps the variability of students' interests in mind and intends to **engage ALL** students.



## **Connecting with Students**

Reflect positive interactions

Use warm facial expressions and eye contact showing care

Demonstrate empathy and support to students

## **Clarifying Intentions for Academic Success**

**Provide specifics &** expectations

Highlight the meaning and purpose of course materials

Provide a variety of successful examples

#### **Focus on Relevance to Students**

Provide relevant and valuable instruction

Utilize stories that help students relate to the course materials

Utilize current events and culture relevant to students'

### **Ample Choices for Students**

Include alternatives that promote choice Allow students to select project topics relevant to their interests

Use students' feedback to make changes to instruction plans

## **Balance Participation**

Include multiple perspectives

Use wait time to prompt thought out responses from students

Use students' feedback to make changes to instruction plans

## **Emotional Support**

Provide care to students' emotional needs

Integrate mindfulness exercises to cope with academic difficulty

Help students reflect on past difficulties and strategies used to overcome
