
Cyberbullying

Preventing Cyberbullying in K-12 Online Environments

Cyberbullying involves any digital and electronic harassment that is overt, unwanted, and repeated acts or Cyberbullying includes verbal or written communications or images transmitted in any manner, aggression, or any other behaviors, that are committed by a student or group of students against another student with the intent to harass, ridicule, humiliate, intimidate, or harm the targeted student. Additionally, cyberbullying can threaten a student's rights and services as well as negatively impact their academic, mental, and physical well-being. Burns Ind. Code Ann. § 20-33-8-0.2 (2013)


